Club Repeaters:

- 2m VK4RDB FM Repeater transmits on 146.875 MHz from Mt Cotton, it has Echolink, all-star and IRLP Node 6633 available
- 70cm/1 VK4RDB FM/DV Repeater transmits on 438.450 MHz from Mt Cotton it has Echolink and All-Star available. This is a Yaesu Digital repeater and can be used in either FM or Digital mode. (Wires X)
- 70cm/2 VK4RDB DV Repeater transmits on 438.825 MHz DMR primary mode, Brandmiester TS1 & FreeDMR TS2, with D-Star as secondary mode.
- 70cm/3 VK4RDB FM All-Star Repeater transmits on 439.625 MHz from Mt Cotton it has All-Star available.
